

Brunei Darussalam commendably achieved a 50% reduction in road traffic fatalities in the last decade, positioning the nation among global leaders in road safety progress. There has been a worrying shift in the number of road traffic accidents and deaths recently, signaling an urgent need for renewed and decisive action to address the rising risks on our roads.

Further to that, the actions focuses on strengthening government agencies capabilities, enhance evidence-based action and enforcement of rules, and upgrade road quality and vehicle safety features. Above all, the most critical goal is to encourage a sense of personal responsibility among all road users.

My sincere appreciation goes to all stakeholders particularly the Brunei Darussalam National Road Safety Council, government ministries, law enforcement agencies, non-governmental organizations, academic institutions, and the private sector whose contributions and dedication have made the development of this Road Safety Action 2030 possible.

ACTION GROUP ON LAW ENFORCEMENT

Development and enforcement of road safety laws and policies.

ACTION GROUP ON TECHNICAL AND INFRASTRUCTURE (KTTI - KUMPULAN TINDAKAN TEKNIKAL DAN INFRASTRUKTUR)

Ensuring Road Safety Infrastructure network in the country comply with international road safety standards.

ACTION GROUP ON RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT (KTPP - KUMPULAN TINDAKAN PENYELIDIKAN DAN PERKEMBANGAN)

To propose and implement research and development plans for National Road Safety Council (MKKJR).

ACTION GROUP ON MEDIA AND SOCIALIZATION

Conduct awareness and education programmes on road safety to all road users.



OBJECTIVE 1: Reduce Road Accidents

Achieve a 50% reduction in road traffic accident frequency by the year 2030.

- Introduce capacity-building programmes for development of road safety professionals.
- Review and update the Brunei Highway Code.
- Modernise the driving school curriculum and licensing assessment standard.
- Implement road safety culture / education programmes for all road users.
- Conduct safety awareness campaigns making road safety as a personal commitment and an individual's core value.
- Establish a quick respond system for road safety remedial works.
- Institutionalise the road traffic data collection and analysis process.
- Upgrade the Road Accident Data Enhancement and Development (RADED) system to enable the identification of accident-prone areas.

OBJECTIVE 2: Reduce Road Accident Fatalities

Achieve a 50% reduction in road traffic fatalities by the year 2030.

- Review and update the national minimum motor vehicle safety standards to align with modernised best practices.
- To build and maintain emergency services preparedness for responding to road traffic accidents through regular exercises.
- Introduce immediate mitigation measures for known high risk roads.
- Implement a "hearts and minds" road safety campaign to create a deep-seated, voluntary commitment to safety, moving beyond mere compliance with rules and regulations.
- Introduce research-based driver behaviour intervention programmes.
- Develop researched-based accident risk prediction models.

OBJECTIVE 3: Achieve 3-Star Minimum Safety Rating for Major Roads

Making 80% of major roads safer with a 3-star minimum safety rating by the year 2030.

- 15 Implement and track progress of road safety improvements identified from the 2nd Brunei Road Assessment Programme (BruRAP2).
- Construction of new major roads to comply with the 3-star safety rating.
- Develop and implement an upgrading programme for existing major roads to comply with the 3-star safety rating.
- Conduct 3rd Brunei Road Assessment Programme (BruRAP3) in 2029.
- Develop International Road Assessment Programme (iRAP) capability for relevant stakeholders to support implementation of standards.
- Implement awareness and knowledge-building programmes on the Road Assessment Programme (RAP) to educate key stakeholders on the technical aspect and drive the adoption.

OBJECTIVE 4: Improve Safe Speed Compliance

Reduction in road traffic fatalities and serious injuries, achieved through better adherence to posted safe speeds.

- Introduction of In-Vehicle Monitoring Systems (IVMS) requirement for targeted vehicles.
- 22 Conduct Multi-agency enforcement operations.
- Review and refresh implementation of the SiKAP demerit system (Sistem Keselamatan Amalan Pemandu).
- Implement dedicated Safe Speed campaigns to highlight speed is a critical risk factor in road accidents.
- Adopt the most effective techniques identified in research for reducing speed related accident fatalities.

OBJECTIVE 5: Zero Major Road Accidents (Multiple Fatalities)

Prevent the occurrence of road traffic accidents that involve multiple fatalities (3 or more deaths), especially involving public transport vehicles (buses, coaches) or dangerous goods.

- Update and enhance the heavy goods vehicles and commercial passenger vehicles driver license assessment and competency programme.
- Implement effective licensing and monitoring systems for public transport and dangerous goods operators, with continuous performance monitoring and accountability.
- Introduce mandatory installation and use of active safety systems in all new and existing public transport and dangerous goods vehicles.
- Conduct assessment on routes heavily used by public transport and dangerous goods vehicles to identify and mitigate high safety risks and infrastructure deficiencies.
- Implement targeted campaigns on the critical issues of driver fatigue and the severe consequences of using mobile phones or other distractions while driving.
